#### Important Notes

It is strongly recommended that transfer students contact CMU early in their college career to ensure proper course sequencing for their major, optimizing course scheduling, and timely degree completion at CMU. CMU advising can be reached at 989-774-7506.

A minimum of 15 hours of PSC and/or PAD course work must be at the 300 level or above.

No more than 15 credits may be double counted with the Political Science Minor.

Courses taken on a Credit/No Credit basis may not be counted toward majors or minors in the School of Politics, Society, Justice, and Public Service, with the following exceptions: internship (PSC 395), practicums (PSC 394) and lab course (PSC 355). In the case of these exceptions, no more than three credits total may be applied to the major or minor.

Transfer students majoring in International Relations will be expected to take at least 15 hours of coursework in the school; transfer minors, 12 hours. Students majoring in International Relations are allowed to count three internship credit hours toward their major.

#### Other Information

BACHELOR OF ARTS Requires completion of the 202 course or higher in any world language, including American Sign Language (ASL). This requirement may also be satisfied by passing the 202 examination or equivalent. Courses used to fulfill this requirement may be double counted with the University Program Group IV-B.

BACHELOR OF SCIENCE Requires completion of a minimum of 9 credit hours of natural or social science at the 300-level or above, at least 6 credit hours from the same designator and no double counting with General Education. Minors are optional.

Please note that this transfer guide is applicable to those transfer students who will be attending CMU's main campus in Mt. Pleasant as well as CMU Online.

#### **General Notes**

- · A grade of C- or better is required for a course to transfer to CMU, the MTA requires a grade of C or better.
- A bachelor's degree requires a minimum of 120 semester hours of credit. Students will need to complete a minimum of 60 semester hours from an
  accredited 4-year-degree granting institution. A minimum of 40 hours must be completed at the 300 level or above. A minimum of 30 semester hours
  of credit must be earned from CMU.
- · The University Program Requirements and competencies may be fulfilled by students who satisfy the MTA Agreement
- Students are required to meet CMU Competency Requirements prior to reaching 56 credit hours. Competency requirements consist of: two Written English (composition) courses, one Oral English (communication) course, and one Mathematics course be completed, each with a grade of "C" or above.

Any remaining required and elective courses for a bachelor's degree will be selected in consultation with an academic advisor to ensure that CMU degree requirements are being met.
